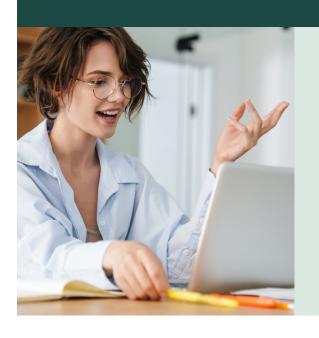

- Result: Share the outcomes of your actions and what you learned.
